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in most people's minds eating disorder conjures images of a thin white upper middle class teenage girl the landscape has changed countless men and women in midlife and beyond from all ethnic backgrounds also struggle with anorexia nervosa bulimia nervosa purging disorder and binge eating disorder some people have suffered since youth others relapsed in midlife often after a stressor such as infidelity divorce death of a loved one menopause or unemployment still others experience eating disorder symptoms for the first time in midlife primary care physicians ob gyns and other practitioners may overlook these disorders in adults or even worse demean them for not having outgrown these adolescent problems treatments for adults must acknowledge and address the unique challenges faced by those middle aged or older midlife eating disorders a landmark book guides adults in understanding why me and why now it shows a connection between the rise in midlife ed and certain industries that foster discontent with the natural aging process it also gives readers renewed hope by explaining how to overcome symptoms and access resources and support renowned eating disorder specialist cynthia m bulik ph d helps partners and family members develop compassion for those who suffer with ed and helps health professionals appreciate the nuances associated with detecting and treating midlife eating disorders

a clinician's guide to binge eating disorder educates the reader about its triggers and behaviours and describes steps to treat it and resume a full and productive life

perhaps the most difficult milestone in a young clinician's career is the completion of the first interview for the typical trainee the endeavor is fraught with apprehension and with some degree of dread if the interview goes well there is considerable rejoicing if it goes badly much consternation results irrespective of the amount of preparation that has taken place before the interview the neophyte will justifiably remain nervous about this endeavor thus the first edition of diagnostic interviewing was devoted to providing a clear outline for the student in tackling a large variety of patients in the interview setting in consideration of the positive response to the first edition of diagnostic interviewing published in 1985 we and our editor at plenum press eliot werner decided that it was time to update the material however the basic premise that a book of this nature needs to encompass theoretical rationale clinical description and the pragmatics of how to once again has been followed and as in the case of the first edition this second edition does not represent the cat's being skinned in yet another way quite to the contrary we still believe that our students truly need to read the material covered herein with considerable care and once again the book is dedicated to them we are particularly concerned that in the clinical education of our graduate students interviewing has been given short shrift

the three volume encyclopedia of behavior modification and cognitive behavior therapy provides a thorough examination of the components of behavior modification behavior therapy cognitive behavior therapy and applied behavior analysis for both child and adult populations in a variety of settings although the focus is on technical applications entries also provide the historical context in which behavior therapists have worked including research issues and strategies entries on assessment ethical concerns theoretical differences and the unique contributions of key figures in the movement including b f skinner joseph wolpe aaron t beck and many others are also included no other reference source provides such comprehensive treatment of behavior modification history biography theory and application thematic coverage the first of the thematic volumes covers adult clinical applications adults are the most common population encountered by researchers clinicians and students and therefore more than 150 entries were needed to cover all necessary methods the second volume covers child clinical applications in 140 entries one especially useful aspect of this volume will be the complications sections addressing what can go wrong in working with children this is an area often overlooked in journal articles on the subject volume iii educational applications addresses a range of strategies and principles of applied behavior analysis positive behavior support and behavior modification and therapy these entries focus on classroom and school contexts in which the instructional and behavioral interactions between teachers and their learners are emphasized unique easy to follow format each of the volumes entries address a full range of mental health conditions and their respective treatments with the aim of providing systematic and scientific evaluation of clinical interventions in a fashion which will lend itself to the particular style of treatment common to behavior modification major entries for specific strategies follow a similar format 1 description of the strategy 2 research basis 3 relevant target populations and exceptions 4 complications 5 case illustration 6 suggested readings 7 key words biographical sketches include the following 1 birthplace and date 2 early influences 3 education history 4 professional models 5 major contributions to the field 6 current work and views 7 future

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conceptual issues resonate within the social phobia literature of particular concern is the ambiguity surrounding how social phobia differs from normal shyness the debate over whether high levels of shyness are synonymous with pathological social anxiety is complicated by the issue of social phobia subtypes information about the relationship of social phobia with pertinent temperament and personality characteristics may further clarify these methodological and clinically relevant issues participants were categorized using the cheek and buss revised shyness scale cheek 1983 there were 148 highly shy and 155 comparison normative shyness participants who were recruited from san diego state university structured interviews cidr who 1998 were used to diagnose social phobia subtypes generalized social phobia gsp and nongeneralized social phobia ngsp participants were then compared on the retrospective self report of inhibition rsri reznick et al 1992 and the neo personality inventory revised costa mccrae 1992 chi square analyses found disproportionately higher rates of social phobia in the highly shy group 49 than in the comparison group 18 there were significantly more participants with gsp 27 in the highly shy group than in the comparison group 3 and there were similar rates of ngsp in each group 22 vs 16 respectively analyses of variance on measures of shyness behavioral inhibition and neuroticism revealed group differences that corresponded to gradations in social anxiety participants with gsp had the most extreme scores followed by participants with ngsp and lastly participants without a social phobia diagnosis logistic regression analyses demonstrated that shyness behavioral inhibition neuroticism and extraversion increased the odds of a social phobia diagnosis or 4 4 or 11 or 9 3 and or 5 9 respectively high shyness and neuroticism were predictors of a gsp diagnosis versus a ngsp diagnosis or 7 27 and or 11 highly shy individuals have a greater propensity to exhibit social phobia specifically gsp than subjects with normative levels of shyness nonetheless it is also possible for an individual to be extremely shy but not diagnosable with social phobia specific risk factors for social phobia were identified and both quantitative and qualitative differences between the subtypes were found

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
